Executive Update



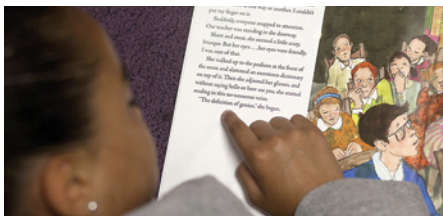

We are thrilled to be entering our 20th year of service to the children of East Palo Alto and eastern Menlo Park. Over the past 20 years EPAK has supported out of town field trips for students who otherwise might not have the opportunity to travel outside their community. We have garnered donations of leveled book rooms and classroom libraries for each school in the Ravenswood City School District. We have provided materials for students to participate in 'hands-on' science projects the district could not afford to supply. We have supported new teachers in setting up their classrooms with basic materials and supplies. EPAK can do this because of the commitment of our donors. We are so thankful that for 20 years you have generously contributed to the education of children in East Palo Alto and eastern Menlo Park.

Classrooms Funded Early 2013

Once again the teachers' applications for micro-grants spanned a wide variety of supplemental learning opportunities. We granted \$84,000 to 171 teachers.

Literacy was the number one category funded. This semester many teachers are taking students on science-related field trips including Vida Verde Science Camp, California Academy of Science, San Jose Tech Museum and Angel Island. All were made possible by EPAK grants.

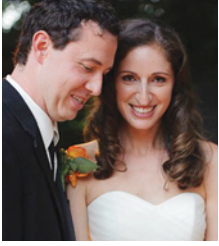
EPAK Day May 31 at Belle Haven
